 - After Hoo-Ha (June 19/20), Thursday night trail work will move to Hillendale as well
 - Massanutten:
 - Until June 19, trail work every Thursday night at 5 pm.
 - This summer's trail work at Massanutten will consist of several small projects.
 - Now we're trying to get Hoo-Ha racecourse tight, which this year will be a big pro race
 - Park on the same side of the road as everyone else park's on (it doesn't matter which side, but Massanutten wants us all on the same side)

 - o George Washington Forest Plan Meeting

 - The GW Forest is revising its forest plan, which it does every 15 years, although it didn't do so last time (because it was so contentious?)
