 - Fun low key event and brought people in from out of town to enjoy the riding

• 2010 City of Harrisonburg Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan

- Will go through City council twice
- The plan will be passed but we need to pack the room in a respectful manner to show them that we support the plan and need implementation on the ground
- City is getting better: Main St will have bike lanes from Port road to Cantrell
- Pizza and drinks will be provided at 6:00 in the green space behind SBC
- Early agenda item for the city council so should be able to get out quick
- Roughly 100 people showed up last time in 2005 and City Council members still talk about it (especially since this is an election year)
- 3-4 folks will say something relating to the issue during public comments at the microphone
- We will be at the council meeting to support and encourage them to keep up the good work

Fundfest Concert

- We provide volunteers for the event and get to split the proceeds with all the other groups who run the fundfest for the entire summer
- We need roughly 20 volunteers to help out with set up food and clean up
- Currently we have around 18 people and they ask for 25
- This should be a \$800-\$1200 fundraiser for the club (Easy Money)

OCP's Shenandoah Valley Bicycle Festival

- Not our event but we help out every year with route markings and ride leaders
- We need volunteers to help with Marking the course (Marshall is the man to see and he has a plan, oh goody)
- Marcia is the one to talk to if you want to volunteer to help with leading a ride
- Diverse group of people come out for the community to do this event (who we do not usually see out and about on bikes)
