Upcoming Events

DR 100 –September 17 – they want more riders, get out there! 50 K and 100 K options. Every cent they net gets donated! Get out there. Also 5 or 10 K run options. Starts from old high school. No bussing this year.

Jeremiah Bishop's Gran Fondo: Saturday, September 24 – Erin Bishop: 150 riders preregistered. – also taking donations to bike coalition or prostate cancer awareness project.
