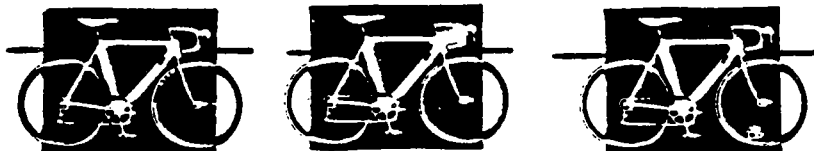
PRESIDENTS CORNER

AGVITHH - 1988

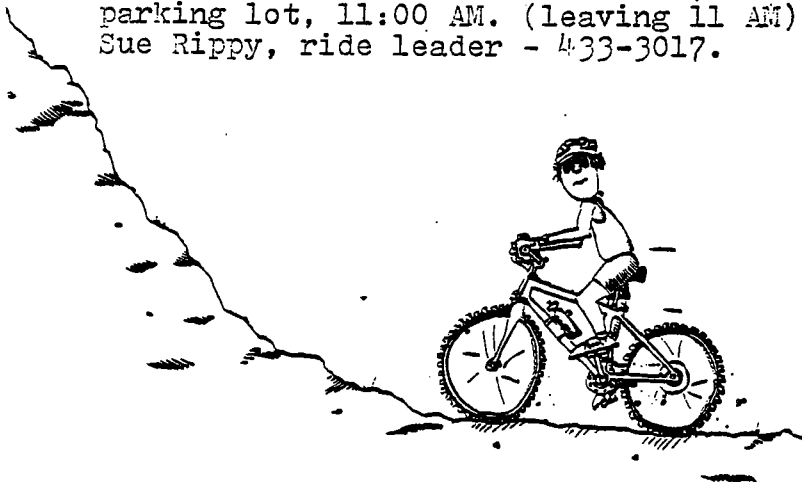

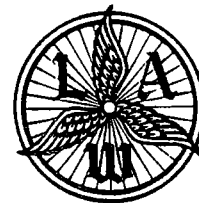

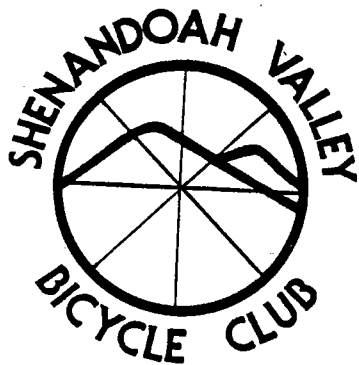
GEAR Up '89

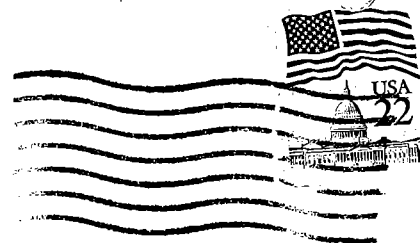
