November Meeting Minutes

Gary Cook, of Planning and Zoning, City of Harrisonburg, gave an overview of the efforts of the 'Bicycle Plan Development Panel'. This group has started looking at potential bicycle routes in the city, linking shopping and recreational areas, schools, and other points of interest. The panel was formed to try to pursue some of the objectives of the 20 year comprehensive plan. Much discussion ensued. One point made by a number of the members is that multi-use, separate, bike paths do not work.

Greg Gum volunteered to take over the newsletter editing duties.

VFR PRESIDENT WILL SPEAK ON CONTAINER DEPOSIT LAW FOR VA

As a cyclist, you get an upclose look at road side litter. Because of this, you may be interested in hearing Paul Hughes, President of Virginians For Recycling, speak on the subject of a beverage container deposit law for our state. His group has been very involved in the drafting of the Comprehensive Curbside and Container (CCC) Recycling Bill which will be introduced by Senator Gartlan in the 1992 session of the VA Senate. Container deposits have been shown again and again to greatly reduce roadside litter.

The meeting will be at 10:00 am on Saturday, January 18, 1992 at Trinity Presbyterian Church in Harrisonburg (intersection of Maryland Ave. and Rt. 42). It is sponsored by the Association of University Women. Come ask your questions, voice your concerns, and show your support.

CALENDAR OF EVENTS


