This leads me to re-visit a familiar issue - bike safety (let me rephrase that - personal safety). We need to remember that most drivers have not had to deal with a large number of cyclists on the road since last October. In other words, WATCH OUT! I'm not going to turn this into a safety commentary, but please remember to wear your helmet, obey all traffic signals and signs, and follow the rules of the road.

Given the timing of this enclosure and our busy season, I have asked Jason and Greg to be our guest speakers at our July monthly meeting/picnic.

As our season of riding picks up, many of us wonder when we will begin seeing some of the new faces which accompany the new (and old) names on our membership roster. Can there really be more to being a member of the SVBC than receiving your newsletter each month, reading about local and regional events, and secretly enjoying my writings? How about getting involved? We have rides for riders of all levels and there are so many opportunities to meet others with varied interests in cycling. I've personally been on a couple of rides that have attracted from nine to eleven participants.

## WANNABES

I have been pleasantly surprised at the popularity of the Club-sponsored Wannabe rides. As an example, before the torrential downpour on June 9th, I was anticipating a group ride of at least fifteen cyclists, which would have included novice group-riders and veteran group-riders. As I write this (June 20th), I believe that the June 30th Wannabe Ride will be attended by a great number of participants. Once again, if you are you a rider (10 to 12 mph) who would like to become smoother, faster, and/or more efficient, but you're not really sure how to accomplish your goals, come out (place to be announced) and join me and the others on my rides on Sunday, July 14th at 1:00pm and July 21st at 1:00pm. Together, we will work, train, and have a good time on our bikes, and hopefully help you meet your cycling goals. We will talk about some of the ways that may improve your riding skills and your speed - techniques that have worked for me and that I continue to use. We will share with each other our experiences and help each other to become better riders. The rides will start at a C pace with a distance of about 10 - 15 miles. Periodically during each ride, the speed will be increased for a short time. At later rides, the speed and/or distance will gradually increase (along with a more challenging terrain) based on the needs of the group. Theses rides are learning/training rides but also FUN rides and at no time will anyone be dropped. So come out, train, and learn with me. I promise that everyone will learn at least one new way to improve your cycling skills. Call me at 828-3599 for more information, like starting point.

## SPECIAL MEETING OF THE MEMBERSHIP

At the last meeting of the executive committee, a resolution was passed to delete two types of memberships available through the Shenandoah Valley Bicycle Club - Associate and Junior. Changing the available memberships requires that the Constitution and By-laws be amended to reflect the changes. Article VIII of the Constitution and the Amendments of By-laws require that the entire membership be notified in writing at least thirty days in advance of a Special Meeting, normally by way of this newsletter. In addition, the changes must be proposed at least one regular club meeting prior to the Special Meeting. The Special Meeting to amend the by-laws will be part of August's regular monthly meeting. The proposed changes to the Constitution and By-laws are as follows:

Change Article III, Section 2 to read as follows:

Types of memberships available:

- a. Individual
- b. Family

Change Article IV, Section 2 to read as follows:

Amount of annual dues:

- a. Individual \$10.00
- b. Family \$15.00

The by-laws do not require a quorum to be present at the Special Meeting to amend the by-laws. This notice covers the entire scope of the changes to the bylaws. No other changes can be considered. Approval of the changes requires at least two-thirds majority of those present at the meeting. There is no requirement for minimum number of executive committee members to be present.
