AGGRESSIVE DRIVER BUSTED

Last week I won a case for all bike riders in the Chesterfield County courts. I was riding a few months ago on Centralia Rd. toward Route 10 (near the new Cobblestone shop), when a car came up from behind me. The passenger was screaming at me but they soon passed. A few minutes later, the same car came around again. This time they were a little worse. They acted wild, screaming and yelling. By this time I had their license plate number and description of the car. About two minutes after this meeting, they came again from behind for the third time and aggressively forcing me off the road and into the ditch. I was able to control the bike and reach my cell phone at the same time. As I was speaking to the police, they started to come from the opposite direction. I got to see the driver and as I held my cell phone and pointed at his license plate as he drove away.

When the police arrived, they asked me to press charges. I said yes!! The police went directly to his home and picked him up. When it finally went to court, the lawyers wanted to lower the charges from assault and battery (just to name one of the three charges) to reckless driving. The judge did not like the plea bargain and threw the book at the driver. He got 6 months in jail (must serve at least 45 days,) pay a \$500 fine, loose drivers license for a year and other restrictions. The judge said that endangering a bike rider is a criminal act and he would not tolerate that behavior.

I guess it all depends on how bike friendly a county wants to be. In Chesterfield, all I did was call 911 and they police did the rest. In Hanover, well I better not say.
