The wheels were spoked, (2 cross) and covered with plastic discs to reduce drag. They had aluminium rims, 17 inch diameter, with quick mount hubs for speedy changes. The wheels were designed by Chester Kyle of AreVironment Inc., whose past efforts included the Gossamer Albatross, the pedal power English Channel Crossing Aircraft. Aircraft.


