EIGHTH ANNUAL CENTURY

Thanks to all the SVBC members who donated baked goods for the Century - they were graciously devoured by our 126 riders this year. The weather conditions could have hardly been more ideal, cool and mostly overcast, although the threat of rain probably kept many riders away.

A number of firsts or bests were accomplished:

- Two people with last names that started with Z.
- Eight-five preregistrants
- Three "fastest" records
- Quarter Century: Brian Manning in 1:29
- Half Century: Dave Sprinkel in 2:35
- Century: Barbara Minor (Lynchburg) in 6:22
- No YellowJackets at Westover (to bad same couldn't be said for the checkpoint)
- The youngest rider to complete the Century, Ben Wyrick, age 13, of Bridgewater.
- The first past SVBC predisent to return from out of town: Mike Kase, Indiana.
- More (twice as many) riders from Lynchburg than Charlottesville.

About 8500 miles were pedaled amongst the quarter, half, and

fifty-two the full century. The riders who are male increased to 79%, continuing the trend since the first SVBC in which the male accounted for 60%. One fourth of the riders were SVBC members.

In spite of not riding even the Worker's Century this year, I believe I had the most fun simply due to all the great help received before and during the day of the ride. Thanks many times over to all. And lastly, many thanks to our perennial poster printer L.B. Branner for his generousity, and the Mr. J's Bagels and Deli for giving us a 2 for 1 deal on all those delicious bage! These folks support cycling in the Valley, we should support them.
