Since the joint City of Harrisonburg and Rockingham County public hearing in May, both the County's (on June 7th) and the City's (on June 15) Planning Commissions approved the Bicycle Plan and passed it onto the Board of Supervisors and City Council respectively. Both these bodies will likely schedule public hearings, separately. Potential dates for the hearings are July 20 or 27 for the County and July 26 for the City. However, until it is on their calendars, it is not certain. Nevertheless, keep these dates open for now.
