SEPTEMBER MEETING MINUTES

The September SVBC meeting was held at Luigi's Rt. 42S on September 11th at 7:30 P.M. President Ben Wyse presided. There were ten members present at any one time. The Treasurer reported a balance of \$4,953.11. The Century insurance of \$360.00 is outstanding. No other expenses were reported for August. Ben presented two videos from the Bicycle Transportation Alliance titled First Gear: An Introduction to Bike Safety. Keister Elementary and Thomas Harrison Middle School will each receive a copy. The club will reimburse SBC for the videos.

Art presented a brief recap of the 24th Annual Century held just the day before this meeting. There were 209 riders placing this Century as the second largest turn out. Art had predicted 210 on Saturday using his mathematical projection formula and number of pre-registered riders. Good job, Art! There were 31 quarter century riders, 83 half century, and 94 century. The most often heard comment was about the delicious food. Thanks, Robin, ably assisted by Sharon, for the paninis and all the good food. Thanks SVBC members for the baked goods! Great job. There will be a Century Wrap-up Meeting Wednesday October 11th at Art's house. Meeting starts at 7:30.

Jack Leetun club VP and co-sponsor of Trash Pick-up, has set the October Pick-up date for Saturday October 14th. Interested picker uppers should meet at the intersection of Amberly and Skidmore. This is just west of town off SR 910. If you need directions contact Marshall through his SVBC e-mail (see the web page under Secretary).

Ben discussed two advocacy items that are taking place this and early next week. On Tuesday September 12th Drew Williams from the Harrisonburg Transportation Department will present the final plan for extending Rockingham Drive as a bike/pedestrian path to Chicago Avenue and ultimately to Greystone Street. This opening of existing city right of way will be the first of its kind in Harrisonburg and will connect JMU to EMU along the bike plan route. The presentation will be at the regular City Council Meeting and is item number 12. Expect Drew to have the floor about 7:30, if you would like to attend. On Monday September 18th there will be a public comment hearing to address the Harrisonburg Parks and Recreation's plan to build bike trails on city property adjacent to Hillandale Park. This meeting is a very important one to support and all cyclists in the area are encouraged to

attend. There have been numerous postings announcing this meeting. If you have questions or want more information contact Ben, Marshall, Paul Johnston, Ken Bell, or Rich Edwards.

There will be a wrap up meeting for the OCP/SVBC Festival on Wednesday September 27th at 8 P.M. We will meet at the Regional Library but will most likely move to SBC as the library closes. OCP sent SVBC a very nice thank you concerning the Festival and anticipated gross receipts of \$2,000. A better recap will be published after the meeting. If you participated in the Festival either helping, marking routes or riding your input would be appreciated. You may give comments to club members Marcia, Marshall, or Ben. Additionally OCP representatives Melaine or Jonathan would like your feedback. Thanks.

Jeremiah announced the beginning of cross

bike training this Tuesday (September 12th). Contact Mike Carpenter for more details. Courses will be at Keister Elementary, Westover Park, and Ralph Sampson Park. Get out the knobbies and come learn cross techniques, fitness, and have fun.

SHENANDOAH FALL FOLIAGE BIKE FESTIVAL. FEATURES: The NEW CENTURY Route offers a tour of eastern Augusta County before crossing into Rockingham County for a brief distance. Total of five rest stops and lunch on this route. On Sunday the ROCKBRIDGE OPTION, a NEW 26 mile route beginning and ending at the Middlebrook Community Center, goes through the watershed divide into Rockbridge County. There is a challenging downhill stretch midway through the route. For fat tire/hybrid bikes the COUNTRY ROADS route has been extended to 22 miles looping into Rockbridge County. (This option takes the place of mountain biking on Sunday.) The Festival is noted for its outstanding rest stops such as Union Presbyterian Church, "the church on the hill." This year four new rest stops have been added to the routes. The ever popular "Apple Dumpling Social" and dance complete the day on Saturday. On Sunday southern Augusta County with the new option lets every cyclist see the surrounding mountains in their glorious fall colors. All in all, participants in the 2006 Fall Foliage Bike Festival will have a memorable weekend filled with good riding, new friends, friendly surroundings and delicious food.
